Financing a college education is a task that requires planning and often some financial sacrifice. However, many students have used this process to achieve their educational goals. Our staff is prepared to assist you in meeting this financial challenge.

We understand a Springfield College education is a lifetime investment. Our goal is to assist you in making this investment affordable. We must develop an assessment of your family's ability to finance a college education. Therefore, we ask you to complete the necessary forms. Information is the key to help our staff assist you in making the right decisions about financing your education. We welcome any information you feel will help us understand your financial status. It is important for you to be informed about the application process. Please read the information we have provided. Pay careful attention to the proper completion of forms and the required due dates.

The financial aid decision letter will advise you of your eligibility for federal, state and college assistance. We will also provide information on alternative financing options. Springfield College grants are awarded based on financial need, with consideration given to your academic, co-curricular and community achievements. The Springfield College Financial Aid application is required for Springfield College need based grant consideration. The Admissions Office may recommend freshmen applicants for a President's Achievers Award. This scholarship program is not based on financial need and no financial aid applications are necessary for consideration. Students will be notified by the Admissions Office if they are selected for a President's Achievers Award.

We know that a family's financial information is extremely sensitive. Be assured that all income information submitted to the Office of Financial Aid is held in strict confidence. You should know that your financial status does not affect your admission to the college. Please feel free to contact us with your questions and concerns.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

1. All applicants must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

The FAFSA is the application for federal and state funded assistance. You are encouraged to file the FAFSA electronically (www.fafsa.ed.gov). You are also encouraged to obtain a federal PIN at www.pin.ed.gov. With this PIN, you will be able to sign the FAFSA on the Web electronically. You may choose to file a paper FAFSA. Paper FAFSAs may be obtained in high school guidance offices or by calling the Federal Student Aid Information Center at 1-800-4-FED-AID. Allow four to six weeks for paper FAFSA processing.

List Springfield College (*Federal code # 002211*) on the FAFSA.

2. Send the completed Springfield College Financial Aid Application to the Office of Financial Aid. The form is available online at www.spfldcol.edu/home.nsf/admissions/financialAid. Please make sure to download the 2010-11 application.

3. Do not wait until you have been accepted for admission to complete financial aid forms.

File forms to meet the priority filing date. Financial aid decisions are issued only to students who have been accepted for admission. *Students accepted after the financial aid priority date will be awarded pending eligibility and availability of funds.*

4. Income verification is required of all applicants.

Income verification is usually a tax return or a benefit statement from the disbursing agency. We prefer to have the documentation prior to the March 15th priority date but we will issue an estimated decision if the income verification is not on file. Send signed documentation *directly* to the SC Office of Financial Aid. Parent income verification is required of all students who are required to provide parental data on the FAFSA (*dependent students*). Do not submit income verification or tax returns to the FAFSA processor. These forms will not be forwarded to Springfield College by external processors.

2009 Parent(s) federal tax return with parent(s) signature. Include all schedules & W2s.

2009 Student federal tax return with student signature. Include all schedules & W2s.

5. The student's name and Springfield College ID number should be clearly and correctly written on all forms. Complete all parts of all forms. Do not leave questions blank. **Keep copies of all forms.**

6. Be sure to allow adequate mailing and processing time.

Due dates refer to receipt of information by the Office of Financial Aid, not the filing date. Late applications reduce access to grant funding. Submit the FAFSA directly to the appropriate processor. Do this at least two weeks prior to due dates. ESTIMATE if you do not have exact figures. Corrections can be made at a time when more accurate data is available. Obviously, good estimates will cause fewer changes in your aid eligibility. Awards are not final until the FAFSA data is received from the federal processor and verification of application data is conducted.

7. If applicable, send a letter to us detailing special circumstances that may impact paying for college expenses. This is not required information but it may help us better evaluate your financial status. Be as specific as possible when reporting changes in family income and/or significant expenses not detailed on other forms. Send your signed statement directly to the Springfield College Office of Financial Aid. Advise us in writing if there are changes to family finances after the FAFSA is completed. Changes in employment status, family size, medical expenses or other major financial events may affect your financial aid eligibility.

8. You will receive two copies of your Financial Aid award letter.

One copy of the letter must be signed and returned to the Office of Financial Aid. This will "reserve" your award.

9. Springfield College does not guarantee funding to all eligible applicants.

EARLY DECISION APPLICANTS – SEPTEMBER 2010 ENROLLMENT

January 31, 2010	Due date for receipt of processed FAFSA/SC Fin Aid App for <i>Early Decision</i> applicants
February 15, 2010	Decision letters mailed to completed <i>Early Decision</i> applicants
March 1, 2010	Due date for Financial Aid Award Reply and Admission Deposit

TRADITIONAL ROLLING ADMISSION - SEPTEMBER 2010 ENROLLMENT

March 15, 2010	<i>Freshmen priority</i> due date for receipt of completed SC FA App and FAFSA by SC
March 25, 2010	Mailing of financial aid decisions <i>begins</i> for freshmen who have been accepted for admission and who have a complete financial aid application on file
May 1, 2010	<i>Transfer priority</i> due date for receipt of FAFSA & SC Fin Aid App & income verification by SC <i>Freshmen</i> due date for Financial Aid Award Reply and admission deposit <i>Freshmen</i> income verification / tax returns due
May 10, 2010	Financial aid decisions mailed to <i>transfer</i> applicants who have been accepted for admission and who have a complete financial aid application on file
June 1, 2010	<i>Transfer applicant</i> due date for Financial Aid Award Reply and admission deposit

JANUARY 2011 ENROLLMENT

December 1, 2010	Due date for FAFSA & SC Fin Aid App & income verification by SC for freshmen & transfers. (<i>We urge you to complete the filing of SC Fin Aid App and the FAFSA by November 1, 2009</i>)
December 21, 2010	Decisions mailed to accepted freshman and transfer applicants

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- ➔ Do NOT delay completion of forms if your taxes have not been filed. *USE ESTIMATED INFORMATION IF NECESSARY.* Corrections can be made upon receipt of completed 2009 tax returns and/or income verification data.
- ➔ SC will make an *estimated* decision (federal, state and SC funded programs) in certain situations when only a completed FAFSA is on file. Awards are not final until the FAFSA and SC Financial Aid Application is received and the data is verified with tax returns. Revised award letters will be sent after verification if award values change. **No appeals will be reviewed until the income verification process is completed.**
- ➔ Applicants who are accepted late or who complete their financial aid files late will receive decisions on a rolling basis. You will have two weeks from the date of the financial aid decision letter to accept/decline the financial aid award and to respond to the Admissions Office.
- ➔ Students who file a FAFSA *only* will be excluded from consideration for Springfield College need based grant funds. File the SC Financial Aid Application to be considered for SC need based grants.
- ➔ Plan ahead and send information to us by mail. We do *not* encourage the FAX transmission of documents.
