The men's lacrosse team plays at Stagg Field, which was renovated in the summer of 2007. The new FieldTurf® field, the 2000th installation of FieldTurf world-wide, replaces the former AstroTurf surface. The stadium, with a seating capacity of 3,867, is lighted according to NCAA standards for night games and has a heated and air conditioned press box. Stagg Field has played host to numerous NCAA football, field hockey, and men's and women's lacrosse championships.

2011 Season Preview

It's difficult for Coach **Keith Bugbee** to be anything but optimistic about the 2011 lacrosse season. Much of the optimism centers around senior midfielder **Mark Eaton**, the 2010 Pilgrim Lacrosse League Player of the Year. Eaton won 200 of his 326 faceoffs a year ago, a .613 percentage.

However, several other midfielders return from last year's 13-6 league championship team. Senior **Kyle Louer** (23 goals-8 assists-31pts), junior **Jarrid Johnson** (14-6-20), senior **Shawn Runyon** (18-14-32), and junior **Mike Delia** (15-18-33) all contributed heavily to the success of 2010.

Junior **Harry Bernstein** and senior **Austin Orsini** are returning attackmen who are exceptionally accurate. Orsini was the third leading scorer on last year's team (19-15-34) while Bernstein contributed 11 goals and six assists.

Defensively, junior **Matt Hudson** and senior **Sean Kerrigan** are strong defensive midfielders while junior **Tim Cimini**, senior **Vinny Senatore**, and junior **Ross Marchegiani** are talented longstick defenders.

First-year goalie hopefuls are **Jacob Redlingschafer** and **Connor Nash**.

- ▼ The Pride has advanced to the Pilgrim Lacrosse League's championship game in all 11 years of the league's existence and has captured the title nine times.
- ▼ Head coach **Keith Bugbee**, who enters his 28th season in 2011, has led the Pride to 23 post season tournaments, and won the NCAA Division II National Championship in 1994.

Keith Bugbee enters his 28th season as head men's lacrosse coach and assistant professor of physical education at Springfield College in 2011. Under his direction, the Pride is one of the top programs in the nation. Bugbee's coaching record stands at an impressive 292-139 (.677 winning percentage). In 2003, he became one of only four active coaches in Division III with more than 200 victories.

Bugbee was named the U.S. Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) Division II Coach of the Year in 1994 and 1995. He coached the North team in the annual North-South All-Star Game in 1995 and was the coach for the West squad in the annual New England All-Star Game in 1986. Bugbee served as president of the New England Intercollegiate

Lacrosse Association and was inducted into the New England Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 2002.

Bugbee's teams have competed in 23 post season tournaments, including 13 NCAA tournaments, and won a national championship. Forty-one of his players have received All-America recognition, including Bob Felt, who was voted the 1994 USILA Division II Player of the Year.

In 2001, Bugbee led the Pride to a school-record 16-2 mark and a No. 5 final national ranking. Springfield College led the nation in scoring and scoring margin.

Bugbee was named the Pilgrim Lacrosse League Coach of the Year in 2003 after leading the Pride to an 11-5 record and an NCAA tournament appearance.
