**John Gibson**, a native of London, England, is in his 12th season as head women's soccer coach and associate professor of physical education at Springfield College.

Gibson was masterful in the 2010 campaign as he took a squad that started 2-3 to another NCAA tournament. The Pride reeled off a 15-5 record en route to its first-ever outright NEWMAC regular season title and tournament championship in the same year. He earned NEWMAC Coach of the Year honors for the fourth time and was also tabbed the New England Women's Intercollegiate Soccer Association (NEWISA) Co-Coach of the Year as he coached Springfield College's first All-America selection since 1992, Courtney Price.

Arguably, Gibson's 2007 squad had one of the finest seasons in program history as it compiled a 16-3-1 record and earned

an at-large bid to the NCAA tournament. During the year, Springfield College posted 14 shutouts, including 11 blank slates at home. In 2005, the Pride went 14-5-3, including a school record-tying streak where the Pride won 10 consecutive matches, while also remaining unbeaten in 12 straight contests. Gibson, the NEWMAC Coach of the Year in 2005, guided Springfield College to its first-ever NEWMAC tournament championship, as the Pride earned its first NCAA Division III tournament berth in school history.

In 11 years at Springfield College, Gibson has won conference Coach of the Year honors four times. For the Pride's outstanding 2005 campaign, Gibson was also honored as the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA)/adidas Division III New England Regional Coach of the Year.

## 2011 Season Preview

The Springfield College women's soccer team will look to repeat a successful 2010 season in which it won both the NEWMAC regular season and tournament championship. In 2011, the Pride hopes to make a trip to the NCAA tournament for the fifth time in seven years.

Entering her senior season, Springfield College will look to **Jackie Moscardelli**, a NEWISA All-New England First Team selection to control the midfield. As a co-captain in 2010, Moscardelli was fourth on the team with nine points off four goals and an assist, including three game-winners.

As for the rest of its offense, the Pride returns more than 60 percent of its scoring and will be led by **Erica Donnelly** and **Katie Mantie**. Mantie finished second on the team with six goals and four assists, while Donnelly pumped in five goals and added four assists in her first year at Springfield College after transferring. Other key contributors will include playmaking midfielders **Jenelle Jahoda** and **Sara Dalton**, who each had at least five points in the 2010 season.

In her first full season as the starting goalkeeper, **Erin Greenstein**, the 2010 NEWMAC Championship's Most Valuable Player, was extremely consistent. Starting all 20 games, she went 15-5 and compiled nine shutouts while saving 86 percent of the shots she faced.
