

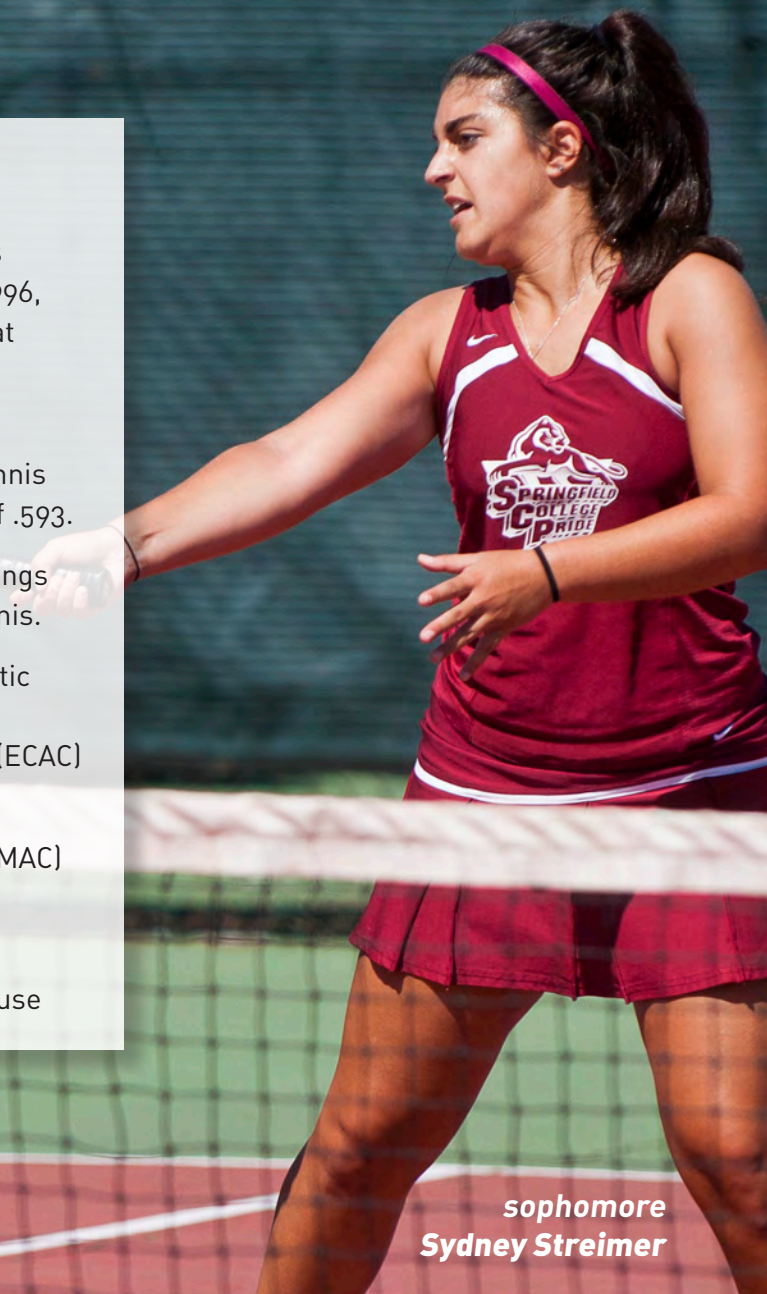

Toby Coffin is entering his first season as the head coach of Springfield College's women's tennis program. He has recently been coaching the varsity girls tennis team at Longmeadow (Mass.) High School and is a member of the U.S. Tennis Association.

Coffin is returning to Springfield College, where he earned his master's degree in physical education in 2001. In his two years at the College, he concentrated in athletic administration and assisted the women's tennis program.

Coffin also currently teaches physical education and health to students in grades 6-9 at the New Leadership Charter School in Springfield.

Along the way in his career, Coffin was also the varsity girls' tennis coach at Cathedral High in Springfield from 2007 through 2010, was the varsity boys' tennis coach at Minnechaug High School in Wilbraham from 2000 to 2003, was a tennis instructor at the Ludlow Tennis Club from 2007 to the present, and was a tennis camp instructor at Springfield College in 2007 and 2008.

Coffin began his college education at Herkimer County Community College in Herkimer, N.Y. where he earned an associate's degree in science in 1988. He moved on to SUNY Cortland in Cortland, N.Y. where he received a bachelor of science degree in physical education in 1990.

Fall Season: August-October

The fall season begins with tryouts and preseason training at the end of August, one week before school starts. Training sessions consist of drills, conditioning, and match-play preparation. An emphasis is placed on team cohesion, physical and mental toughness, and competitive strategy. During the fall season, Springfield College plays between two and three matches per week. In addition, the Pride's top players compete in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association Regional Individual Tournament, and the team participates in the New England Women's Intercollegiate Tennis Tournament, the oldest running intercollegiate tennis tournament in the country. The season culminates with the New England Women's and Men's Athletic Conference championships, with hopes of qualifying for the NCAA championships in the spring.

Spring Season: February-May

Coordinated by the assistant coach, the spring season is an important part of the overall program for both player development and team bonding. The hitting sessions during the winter take place in the three-year-old Springfield College Field House. Four courts, surrounded by netting, are available. During spring break, the team travels to a warm-weather destination, such as Florida or Puerto Rico, to compete against other teams from around the country before returning to Springfield to play several matches in March and April.
